

How to Write SMART Goals

Remember a SMART goal answers the following:

Specific: How many & which

Measurable: As evidence by and what data measure

Attainable: Will be and level of quality

Relevant: In relation to

Time Bound: By when

Example: **By Spring 2010**, **65% of my 5th grade Hispanic males** will be at AL 3 or above **in Reading** as evidenced by the FCAT Reading Report.

Example: **By April 2010**, **68% of my 9th grade economically disadvantaged females** will be at AL 3 or higher in **math** as evidenced by the FCAT Math Report.

Example: **By Spring 2010**, **80% of my 8th grade art students** will be able to define **content vocabulary** as evidenced by the end of the year vocabulary exam.
