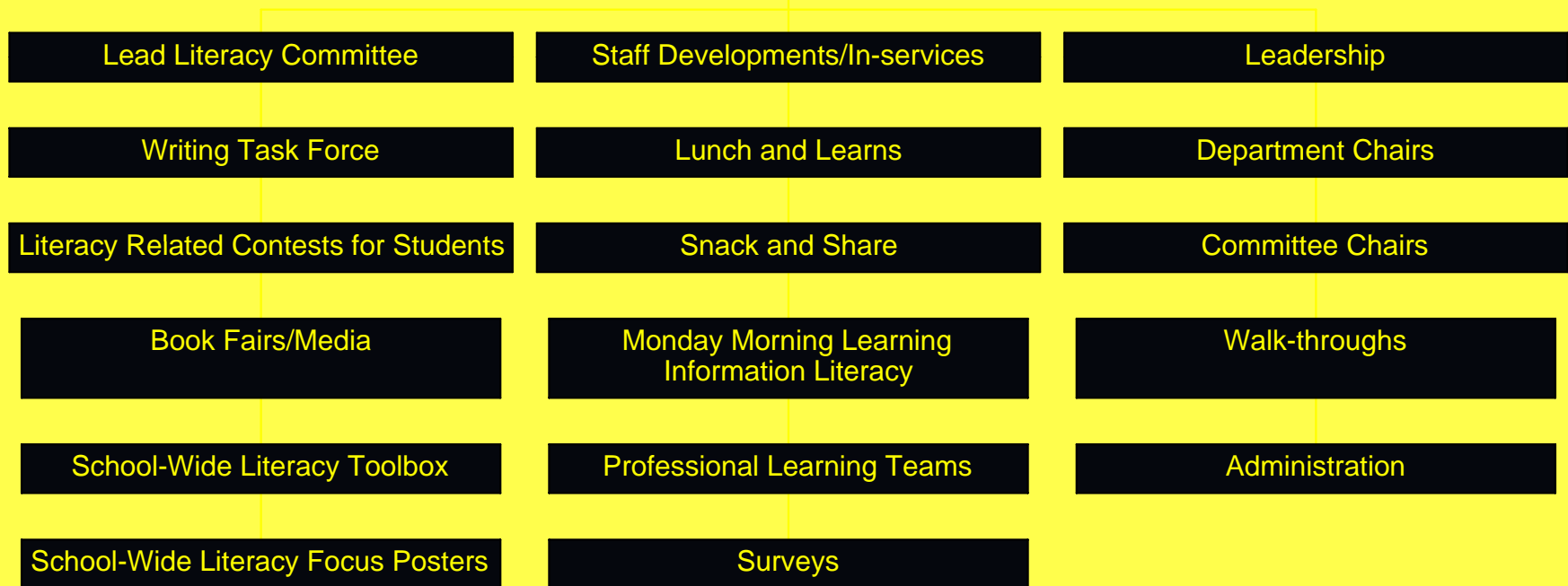

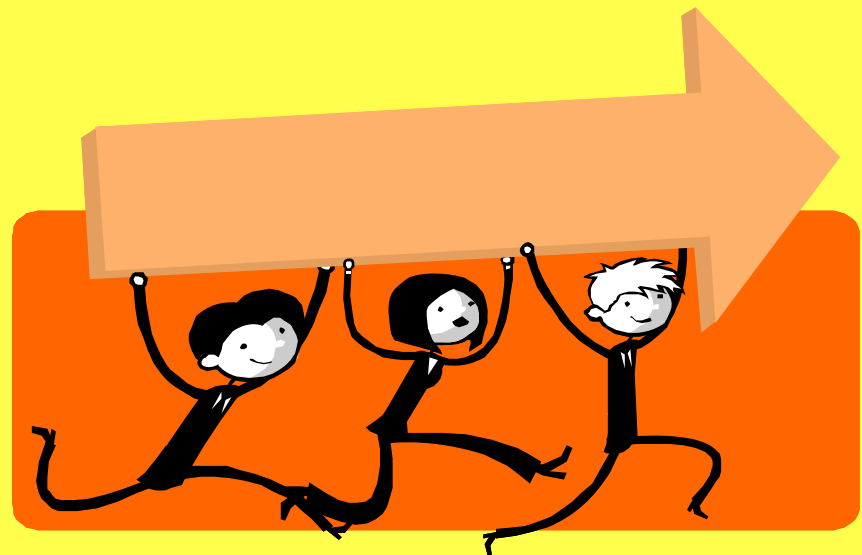

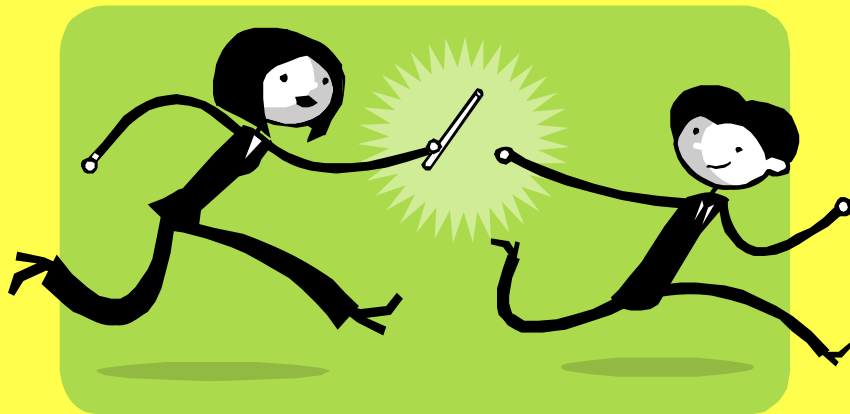


# Lead Literacy Team
