



Tier Three (Choose One)

Write an 800 word research paper on a composer, musical era, or musical genre. Include historical and cultural relevance. Prepare a class presentation.

OR

Compose an original musical composition of at least 32 measures or arrange an existing piece . The final form must be correctly notated either by hand or by using music software. In addition, the student must present either a recorded or live performance of the piece. The student may choose the following formats:

- 4 part choral piece including appropriate text.
- Piano solo based on a major musical period
- Instrumental solo with piano accompaniment
- Instrumental ensemble (duet, trio, quartet, etc.)

Each student is responsible for keeping a reflective journal which also contains a checklist of requirements. This checklist serves as a guide/timeline for both the student and the instructor.

The scope of the Honors curriculum necessitates that the requirements be worked on throughout the current school year. Schools which utilize the 4X4 curriculum will award the extra honors weighting during the second semester.

Goal:

To offer honors credit to music students who wish to enrich their personal musical performance, musical perceptivity and artistic sensitivity as well as overall musicianship through a self-guided course of study in addition to the requirements of the course in their major area of interest (Band, Chorus, Orchestra, and Piano).

Prerequisite:

The student must be a part of a high school ensemble that meets during the school day and have the approval of the instructor.

Course Requirement

The following tiers are required for the honors credit and are in addition to the normal requirements of the course.

Tier One (Mandatory)

Major and minor scales (all forms) as defined by course. All major and minor arpeggios as defined by course.

Complete a reflective journal each grading period.

Attend and critique four (4) performances a year outside of the school day, which the student is not involved in or part of the required curriculum

Pass the final exam.

Tier Two (Choose Three)

Prepare and perform by memory, solo repertoire of appropriate difficulty level in addition to the normal requirements of the course. (Instructor approval required).

OR

Accompany a soloist or ensemble for FOA, FVA, or FBA events. OR

Prepare solo literature for adjudication for FOA, FVA, or FBA events. OR

Prepare/perform one movement of a concerto for competition or performance (instructor approval required).

Course Requirement

Prepare solo literature for adjudication for FOA, FVA, or FBA events. **OR**

Prepare/perform one movement of a concerto for competition or performance (instructor approval required).

PIANO VI – Honors

Description:

Piano VI Honors provides students with large group, small group and solo experiences in piano performance. Emphasis will be placed on the rehearsal and performance of quality piano solo literature from a variety of periods and styles. As an honors course, the focus will be on cooperative learning as well as individualized instruction, student leadership, a written comprehensive examination and musical evaluation of skills through ensemble performance and/or individual solo performance, accompanying experiences, written critiques, reflective journal, research paper or musical composition.

Prerequisite: Instructor's Approval

Special Note: Satisfies Fine Arts Requirement

Outcomes in addition to regular course requirements:

1. Major and minor scales (all forms) as defined by course.
2. All major and minor arpeggios as defined by course.
3. Prepare and perform by memory, solo repertoire of appropriate difficulty level in **addition** to the normal requirements of the course. (Instructor approval required).

Music Honors Course Description (cont.)

4. Accompany a soloist or ensemble for FOA, FVA, or FBA events.
5. Prepare solo literature for adjudication for FOA, FVA, or FBA events.
6. Prepare/perform one movement of a concerto for competition or performance (instructor approval required).
7. The student must attend one outside musical performance per quarter and submit written critiques on each.
8. Complete a reflective journal each grading period.
9. The student must prepare an 800 word paper on a major composer, musical era, or musical genre and present to the class. Instructor's approval required on choice of subject.

OR

Compose an original musical composition of at least 32 measures. The final form must be correctly notated either by hand or by using music software. In addition, the student must present either a recorded or live performance of the piece. The student may choose from the following formats:

- a. Four part choral piece including appropriate text.
- b. Piano solo based on a major musical period.
- c. Instrumental solo with piano accompaniment
- d. Instrumental ensemble (duet, trio, quartet, etc.)
