

REGIONAL EVALUATOR SCORE SHEET (RES)

This 8.5 X 14" sheet will be used to score each individual competing in a particular room for Rounds 1 and 2. Each scorer will be responsible for recording the answers for two or three teams.

At the bottom of the RES the round number should be entered and the room name written in the space provided (if not previously supplied). The legend used for the scoring listed at the top left of the RES. Each RE scorer is also serving as a subject-area judge; therefore, he/she will receive a set of questions and will be seated with the other judges. Each scorer should be seated to best observe the members of the teams which he/she will be scoring.

The RES score sheet will be given to the RE by the coordinating judge before each competition. Additionally, the names of all team members will be available on printouts in the coordinating judge's packet. The scorer should write the names of the team members in the spaces provided before the round begins, making note of the seating position of each team member.

A round of competition consists of sixty-five (65) questions, and the team members use the button to have the opportunity to answer the questions. Only one team has the opportunity to answer each question. If the question is missed, it is not open for another team to attempt to answer. A round also has three team questions, but these team questions are **not** to be used in your scoring.

As team members answer, scores of +1 or -1 (or abbreviated +,-) should be recorded in the spaces provided on the RES under the appropriate subject area. A score of +1/2 (or +.5) is recorded for each team member who assists in giving a correct answer, and a - 1/2 (or -.5) is recorded for each member who assists in giving an incorrect answer. A player is credited with an assist when he/she gives information to another player who in turn pushes the button and gives the response. Several players may receive half points for an assist on the same question. The RE scorer should feel free to stop the reader at any time that a determination of which student(s) answer the question cannot be made.

Each team member's net scores is calculated by adding the +1, -1, +1/2, and -1/2 for that student. This is entered in the column at the extreme right of the RES. The RES should then be signed on the line provided at the bottom. Three judges will be completing ranking forms during the competition. These will be turned in to you. Take these and your RES to the All America Team coordinators after each round.
