What is the Florida PIRC at USF?

The Florida Parental Information and Resource Center (PIRC) at the University of South Florida (USF) is a center funded by the US Department of Education. The PIRC's goal is improved parental involvement in education so Florida's students:

- 1) are better prepared to enter school, and
- 2) increase in their academic achievement.

What can the Florida PIRC at USF do for you and your child's school?

1. *Provide training, information, and services that strengthen the relationship between parents, schools, and early childhood programs.*
For example:
 - ◆ Training workshops for parents and educators
 - ◆ Tip sheets for parents and educators
 - ◆ Website with resources (www.floridapirc.usf.edu)
 - ◆ Electronic communication of parent involvement news
 - ◆ Regional parent involvement learning communities to exchange ideas
 - ◆ Outreach to underrepresented families to support parent involvement in education
 - ◆ Connections to other organizations that support parent involvement.
2. *Coordinate, collaborate, and network to increase parent involvement for academic achievement by increasing understanding and best use of state and federal systems and safeguards, including:*
 - ◆ FCAT (Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test)
 - ◆ School and state report cards
 - ◆ Public school choice
 - ◆ Free tutoring for those who qualify (Supplemental Educational Services, SES)
 - ◆ Rights and opportunities for your child under the *No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act*
 - ◆ School-parent compacts.
3. *Develop and support research-based parent involvement practices that improve student achievement.*
For example:
 - ◆ Trainings and workshops in subject areas (math, science, and reading)
 - ◆ Strategies for parents to help children with schoolwork
 - ◆ Policies to help parents and educators communicate effectively
 - ◆ Conferences to turn what we **know** are best practices into what we actually **do**
 - ◆ Early childhood home visiting programs (*Parents as Teachers, PAT*).
