 - Regional parent involvement learning communities in your area
 - Outreach, especially to underrepresented families, to support their effective involvement in their children's education
 - Partnerships with faith-based organizations that support parental involvement
 - Effective use of parent-school compacts.
- **3.** Use and develop research-based parental involvement practices, activities, programs, and policies that are linked to improving student academic achievement, such as:
 - Math And Parent Partners (MAPPS)
 - Teachers Involving Parents in Schoolwork (TIPS)
 - Parent Involvement Research-to-Practice Symposium
 - Parents As Teachers (PAT) home visiting program.
